Viagra vs. Condoms

- Examination of the development, propagation, acceptance and use of condoms and Viagra for exploring contexts, processes and factors that shape sexuality and policies related to sexuality.
- Juxtaposing condoms and Viagra affords sharp contrasts, which focus attention on cultural and societal norms, religious injunctions, perceptions of femininity and masculinity, in the context of national identities and the neo-liberal economy. This understanding might help to better identify points and ways of influencing these processes.
- This paper centres on the Indian experience; it attempts to tease out the processes and factors that have inhibited the acceptance of condoms, the project to develop a homogenised consensual version of 'Indian male and female sexuality.

Viagra – Bolt from the Blue



- Serendipitous discovery in 1996 while testing Sildenafil citrate for treating angina
- FDA approval in 1998 record time
- Emergence of treatment for erectile dysfunction (ED)
- Side effects
- Interaction with widely used medication for diabetes, hypertension, high cholesterol and recreational drugs eg. 'poppers
- Patent for pulmonary arterial hypertension in 2005

Ayurvedic concepts

- Body minature of the cosmos
- Seven vital body fluids dhatu, in harmony
- 40 drops of food → 40 days → 1 drop of blood
- 40 drops of blood → 1 drop of bone marrow
- 40 drops of bone marrow →1 drop of semen
- Anxiety about semen

Family planning policy

- Priority of the state to control the fertility of its citizens
- Preference for permanent/semi-permanent physician controlled female centred methods, no place for condoms
- Shift to male centred vasectomy, use of coercion
- Severe backlash government falls
- FP not empahsised

Condoms in India

- Earlier low profile, favour women centred semipermanent or permanent methods
- Aggressive promotion with the HIV epidemic
- De-emphasis of male condoms
 - Abstinence and ABC strategy advocated by PEPFAR
 - Downsizing of the estimate of the HIV prevalence in India
 - Advent of antiretrovirals and counselling and prevention taking a back seat
 - Currently want to re-emphasise prevention but no clear policy


Debacle of the vibrating condom



- From insert Crezendo Vibrating Ring For Ultimate Pleasure --- you can take your lovemaking to places it hasn't been before, ...designed to take you for a 20 minute joyride through the realms of vibrating pleasure. It provides the ultimate stimulation for you and your partner. It is truly your passport to "The Republic of Pleasure"
- Banned because this sex toy will have serious repercussions on Indian way of life

Female condoms (FC)

- FC 2 received FDA approval 15 years after FC
- Already in use for several years in many countries
- FDA classifies female condoms differently from male, same category as implants such as pace maker, heart valve, silicone breast implant and requires clinical trial rather than reports of leakage and breakage
- New FC2 over comes many design flaws but still cannot be used in secret
- Many believe that it will have a niche market in women sex workers




Figure 6: Representation of reported concepts of attraction, love, intimate physical relationships and possible outcomes*

Now sex education books that do not mention words like intercourse, condoms and masturbation



Sex education debate

- Contesting views, sex education encourages sexual permissiveness, an encouragement
- Creates an 'immoral society' and collapse of the educational system
- Should not contain illustrations and text that are 'too brazen and explicit and hurt peoples cultural sensitivity







'Weakness' and Erectile dysfunction

- Ayurvedic holistic perspective -Physical and psychological
- Social relationships partners should be physically, emotionally and spiritually involved with each other. Further, it explains that touch; smell, food, music and ambience play a vital role in developing, increasing and prolonging intimacy
- Pre-viagra biomedical treatment was essentially psychological
- Viagra legitimised erectile dysfunction as a physical disorder the reductionist approach
- Has this reduced the stigma of impotence?


Performance of Viagra in the Indian market

- The patent regime did not work in viagra's favour
- Price rather than 'original' product sways the market
- Marketing promotion through medical professionals and pharmacist
- Increasing awareness of health professionals and patients

Viagra and women- new markets

- Women on antidepressants report sexual dysfunction
- Non compliance to antidepressants attributed to this dissatisfaction
- A small (49 in each group) prospective randomised double-blind placebo controlled trial
- Subjective measurements
- Women who took viagra report much higher side effects
- Company funded but not 'influenced.'








- Virtual network on Facebook, involved the apathetic elite

People's Health Manifesto 2009

Gender and Health

- Abolish all coercive laws, policies and practices that violate the reproductive and democratic rights of women, including the two child norm.
- Stop coercion in the use of contraception; make user-controlled contraceptives available.
- Ensure safety, transparency and accountability in all clinical trials, and guarantee that the post-trial benefits of research are made available to women even from marginalized groups. Ensure disclosure of funding and of potential conflict-of-interest in all clinical trials, medical research and publications.
- Make mandatory the inclusion of women's organizations and women's health advocates on ethics committees, from national to local and institutional level.
- Recognize violence against women as a public health issue and ensure provision of necessary services. Ensure prosecution and conviction of violators.
- Include the topic of "Violence against women" and "sexuality and gender" as part medical and paramedical curricula.
- Repeal Section 377 of the Indian Penal Code, and other laws, policies and practices that discriminate on the basis of sexuality.

Condom and Viagra Paradox

- A time tested safe preventive technology is accepted with reservation while new uncertain potentially dangerous technologies are embraced
- Partly explainable by
 - Privileging of curative over prevention
 - Enhancing male capabilities
 - Backed by current 'science' and methods
 - Global trends- globalisation, free market, neoconservative ideology, resurgence of conservative elements in all religions, reassertion of national identities
